Kevin was born on February 12, 1971 in Los Angeles, CA.He spent his childhood in Richfield, MN.Kevin graduated from Richfield Highschool in 1989. Kevin was a beloved brother, son, and friend; shaped views of biblical manhood, and inspired those to live more relationally.

Kevin taught us the power of hospitality and opening one's home to strangers. He taught us how sharing a table with someone you think you have little in common with can topple barriers and forge a lifetime bond. He taught that right thinking and right feeling about God go hand in hand. He taught us that it is okay to cry.

So many people had a chance to be social and feel loved and have community because of Kevin - because he cared and also because he saw people's potential and encouraged them.If you were inspired by Kevin, you were inspired by Jesus.

We miss you Kevin.We will see you in Heaven.You left an impression on many, lead many to Christ, and will be missed by all who knew you.
